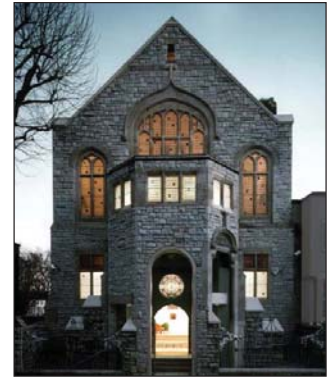

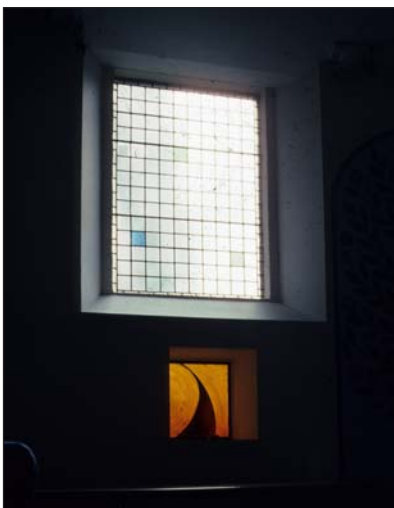
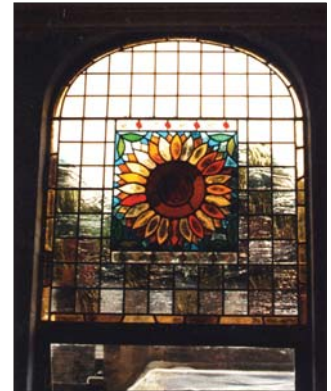
Six windows for therapy rooms

Fire (0.53m x 0.53m) Sunflower (1.2m x 1.44m) 1999-2002



Six stained glass windows were commissioned including the two featured here. *Fire* is installed in the foyer and *Sunflower* is situated on the first floor. Breast Cancer Haven is a charitable trust which provides a non-institutional place of welcome where women suffering from breast cancer (and their families) can turn for free counselling, telephone advice, complimentary therapies, and self-help techniques.

Its first day-centre opened in 2000 in a former Welsh Presbyterian church on Fulham Broadway.



The building required a major transformation and Helen Whittaker worked with Devereux Architects to introduce stained glass memorial windows to enable those visiting the centre to remember those who have suffered.
