St. Martin - Two South Porch Windows (each 0.3m x 0.84m)

The designs for the east and west south porch windows are based on the central theme of St Martin, to whom the church is dedicated. In the west window a roundel depicts St. Martin dividing his cloak in two, giving half to a beggar; in the east, Christ appears before St. Martin wearing the half cloak.

The background glazing is inspired by a geometric pattern from a window on the north side of the church. The pattern incorporates a vine finishing in fleur-de-lis and grapes, symbolising the Trinity and France, St. Martin's homeland.
